You can share any of the e-books together but, if you want your child to practise reading using their phonic knowledge, click on ages '5-6' then on the drop-down menu that says 'Levels' then 'Letters and Sounds Phase' then 'Phase 4' or 'Phase 5' and it will give you a selection of books that they should be able to read themselves.</li> </ul> <p><b>More Phonics:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <a href="https://www.ictgames.com/mobilePage/viking/index.html">https://www.ictgames.com/mobilePage/viking/index.html</a> Select the sounds that you know to practise. Listen to the words and select the correct sounds to spell them.</li> <li>• <a href="http://www.ictgames.com/mobilePage/literacy.html">www.ictgames.com/mobilePage/literacy.html</a> Select any of the games to practice phonics knowledge and spelling.</li> <li>• Search YouTube for either the 'Phase 4 Tricky Word Song' or 'Phase 5 Tricky Word Song' to recap on the tricky words we have learnt.</li> <li>• Phonics live session on Youtube from 10am - Watch live on the day or catch up - Search 'Twinkl Kids TV YouTube' channel.</li> </ul>
Maths	<p><b>Date and Weather:</b> Access <a href="https://www.ictgames.com/mobilePage/dateChart/index.html">https://www.ictgames.com/mobilePage/dateChart/index.html</a> and complete the chart each morning. Talk about what the weather is like, what day it is and what the date is.</p> <p><b>White Rose Maths:</b> The maths scheme we use, 'White Rose Maths', have released some <u>daily</u> home learning activities: <a href="https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-1/">https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-1/</a></p> <p><b>Times Tables:</b> Please practice your times tables, specifically 2, 5 and 10. 'Top Marks' has a range of games – <a href="https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/5-7-years/times-tables">https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/5-7-years/times-tables</a></p> <p><b>Problem solving:</b> If you feel like a problem solving challenge, try <a href="https://nrich.maths.org/primary">https://nrich.maths.org/primary</a></p> <p><b>Adding and subtracting (within 50 - 2digit and 1 digit numbers):</b> ask your adults to write some addition and subtraction sums for you to solve. Science	<p><b>Sink or Float:</b> Try completing an experiment in your house. Make a chart and choose objects to test with, write on your chart whether you think the object will sink or float in water. Then fill the sink/bath with water and choose to test one object at a time. Look back to your chart, was your guess correct? Why did some objects sink and some float?</p>
Geography	<p>Compare the life, food, cities, landscapes and weather of all of the counties in the UK. Many resources for this can be found on the 'Twinkl' website. This information can be presented anyway that you wish.</p>
History	<p>The NHS do amazing work for us and they are working even harder than usual at this difficult time. I would like you to find out all about a special nurse from the past called; <b>Florence Nightingale</b>.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Complete some research and find out the following;</li> </ul> <p>Where was Florence born? When was Florence born? What did she do that made her special? What would you say to Florence if you met her today? You can use <b>Twinkl</b> to help with the research.</p>
P.E	<p>Youtube have some brilliant channels for children to be active or relax.</p> <p><b>Cosmic Kids Yoga</b> A combination of yoga, mindfulness and relaxation to get your day off to a fun, calm and balanced start. There are a huge range of different videos on the channel.</p> <p><b>Joe Wicks</b> You could also access the daily 'Joe Wicks' workouts at <b>9.00am live on YouTube!</b> If you feel like doing them later than 9am, don't worry, they are saved on his channel every day.</p> <p><b>The Learning Station</b> We often have a dance and sing to this station in class, so children should recognise some songs.
