If you do, please share it together, or you could watch the author, Eric Carle, reading it on YouTube: <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=vkYmvxPOAJ">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=vkYmvxPOAJ</a></li> <li>• Talk about the beginning, middle and end of the story and pick a key event from each section. Draw a picture of each event and then have a go at putting the pictures in the correct order. You could then use your pictures to tell the story to a different family member! Or record yourself telling the story and upload it to Tapestry – we would love to see it!</li> <li>• Do you have any other stories at home that are about minibeasts? You could read them together with a grown-up or watch them on YouTube.</li> </ul> <p>Please continue to practise writing your name.</p>
Mathematics	<p>Please continue to access the websites and activities previously provided, such as the 'White Rose Maths' website which provides a fantastic selection of activities weekly. Personal, Social & Emotional Development	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Talk about how the weather has changed lately and which season we are coming into. Talk about the sort of clothes you might wear and other things you might need to do to keep yourself safe in the sun. You could make a poster to remind people of how to stay safe in the sun and upload a photograph of your poster to Tapestry for us to see!</li> </ul>
Physical Development	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Continue to complete the activities previously provided such as Joe Wicks and Cosmic Yoga.</li> <li>• You could make an obstacle course! You could use chalks or objects and challenge your family to see who can complete it in the fastest time using a timer. You must remember to make sure that it is safe!</li> <li>• Please continue to develop your fine motor skills using the ideas previously provided.</li> </ul>
Understanding the World / Expressive Arts & Design	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Can you go on a minibeast hunt?
