Literacy / Communication and Language	<p>Please continue to access the e-books and phonics games and activities previously provided.</p> <p>Phonics: Please continue to access the BBC Bitesize Phase 3 phonics lessons if you have not already completed them, and continue to complete the follow on activities as previously suggested.</p> <p>If you have completed the Phase 3 phonics lessons and covered all of the sounds in Phase 3, please use either the following sheet or the game 'Flashcard Speed Trials' on phonics play (https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/member-only/Flashcards.html) to see which sounds they can confidently recognise independently. Make a note of which sounds they are unsure of and please revisit them using the lessons on the BBC bitesize website and some of the phonics websites previously provided. *Please note, the log-in for the 'Phonics Play' website is: Username – march20 Password - home</p> <p>There are some fantastic 'comics' that are fully decodable for your child to practise reading the new sounds they have learnt in words and simple sentences. You can access these via this link: https://phonicsplaycomics.co.uk/comics.html then select the comics that contain the sounds that you have identified that your child can confidently recognise from the above assessment.</p>
Mathematics	<p>Please continue to access the websites and activities previously provided, such as the 'White Rose Maths' website which provides a fantastic selection of activities weekly. Here is the link: https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/early-years/</p> <p>Mathematics Mastery - https://www.mathematicsmastery.org/free-resources Please access the activities in the 'Reception' section of this website to help to consolidate your understanding of numbers to 20.</p> <p>NRICH - https://nrich.maths.org/13371 Access the 'Early Years Activities' section and complete a few activities from each section to consolidate your knowledge of Number, Shape and Space, and Measure.</p>
Personal, Social & Emotional Development	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Talk about how the weather has changed lately and which season we are coming into. Talk about the sort of clothes you might wear and other things you might need to do to keep yourself safe in the sun. You could make a poster to remind people of how to stay safe in the sun and upload a photograph of your poster to Tapestry for us to see! You could use your phonic knowledge to add labels or even write some sentences!
Physical Development	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continue to complete the activities previously provided such as Joe Wicks and Cosmic Yoga. • You could make an obstacle course! You could use chalks or objects and challenge your family to see who can complete it in the fastest time using a timer. You must remember to make sure that it is safe! • Please continue to practise your handwriting in your book using the letter formation rhymes.
Understanding the World / Expressive Arts & Design	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This half term, our topic was 'Bugs and Beanstalks' where we would be focussing on minibeasts. Can you go on a minibeast hunt? You could use this checklist from Twinkl to help you to record what you find: https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resource/T-T-019-Minibeast-hunt-sheet • After your minibeast hunt, you could select your favourite minibeast and have a go at making it – be as creative as you like! We would love to see what you make, so please upload a photo to Tapestry of your creation! • Our main focus story for this half term was, 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' by Eric Carle. If you have a copy of this story at home, please share it together, or you could watch the author, Eric Carle, reading it on YouTube: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=vkYmvxPOAJI After you have read the story, talk about the lifecycle of a caterpillar. You could have a go at acting it out or drawing it. There are some fantastic resources on Twinkl to support this! You could also do some research on caterpillars and make a fact file, using your phonic knowledge to write some sentences about it. Don't forget to use finger spaces!
