Present it in a form of your choice  Geography: Road trip tour of Europe: utilise Google Maps to take a virtual tour of a country/city of your choice in Europe.  Take a look at the country's food, language, sports, famous landmarks and anything else that you find interesting. You can make a note of all the information you find out in your home-school workbook. Then you could visit another country and build up your knowledge. You can take a virtual tour of as many European countries as you like. Collect the information and then present your tour in a form of your choice: a power point, tour guide, mini geography book and fact file for kids etc.
History	HISTORY	History: Life in Ancient Egypt project: include important Pharaohs, customs, food, the river Nile and its importance, how they lived, writing (hieroglyphics), mummies, pyramids and the significance of this early civilization.  Present it in a form of your choice: a power point, mini history booklet, museum guide, fact file for other children etc.
