Monday	Writing	Name writing	Practise writing your name independently. Only copy it if you need to. If you can write your first name confidently, practise your last name.
	Phonics	New Phase 3 sound: 'y'	Today's new sound is 'y'. Please watch the 'Twinkl' lesson and join in - https://youtu.be/HEa6HN7pd_0 After the lesson, complete the activity on page 8 in your CGP phonics workbook.
	Maths	Number 9	Watch Numberblocks Series 2 Episode 4, 'Nine', on BBC iPlayer - https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b08phbzc/numberblocks-series-2-nine Talk about what you saw on the episode. Look at the pictures of Four and Nine (attached). Talk about what is the same (they are both squares, they both have 4 corners and sides) and what is different (Nine is bigger and has more blocks). Go on a square hunt around your house! What can you find that is the same shape as Four and Nine? You could use the attached 'Is it square?' sheet to record your findings or simply take pictures of what you find.
	Physical Development – Fine motor skills	Getting ready!	Your challenge today is to practise fastening buttons and zips. This is to help you to become more independent when getting dressed! Select an item of clothing that has either of the above and have a go at fastening and unfastening it. Weekly challenge – I would like you to get dressed independently every day. Ask someone to time you and see if you can beat your time every day – keep a record and let us know what your best time is! Upload this to Tapestry at the end of the week.

Select the game 'Sentences', select 'y', then have a go at reading the sentences.
	Writing	Introducing capital letters and full stops	Complete page 9 in your CGP phonics workbook, focusing on identifying capital letters and full stops. Talk about how capital letters always go at the beginning of a sentence or a name, and full stops go at the end to show that the sentence is finished.
	Maths	Number 9	Complete the 'Number Bonds to 9' activity attached. Once you complete this, you could have a go at the challenge on the following page.

Wednesday	Phonics	Phase 3 sound: 'z'	Today's new sound is 'z'. Please watch the 'Twinkl' lesson and join in - https://youtu.be/iijkT-2laHk After the lesson, please complete the activity on page 11 in your phonics workbook.
	Writing	Space sentences	Think of, and write, a simple sentence to match each picture on the 'Space Writing Activities' sheet attached. Remember to use your phonic knowledge to segment the sounds in the words and use the word bank at the top for help with key words. Here is an example of what you could write: "The astronaut is on the moon."
	Maths	Number 10	Watch Numberblocks Series 2 Episode 5, 'Ten', on BBC iPlayer - https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b08phr1g/numberblocks-series-2-ten Practise counting to 10 on your fingers. Complete the 'I Spy Number Ten' activity attached.
	Expressive Arts & Design	A rocket for Baby Bear	Recap on the story, 'Whatever Next!' by Jill Murphy from last week. You could even listen to Miss Pigg reading it again on Tapestry if you like! Can you design a new rocket for Baby Bear? Think about what you might use to make it and what features it will have. You could draw it or even make it using items you have at home – be as creative as you like!

Thursday	Phonics	Phase 3 sound: 'z'	Watch the BBC Bitesize video to recap on our new sound, 'z', and complete the activities - https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zvq9bdm/articles/zrj6jhv After the lesson, please complete the activity on page 12 in your CGP phonics workbook.
	Writing	Letter formation	Practise writing the two sounds you have learnt this week: 'y' and 'z'. Use the formation rhymes to help: y – 'Down a horn, up a horn, under his head and flick' z – 'Zig, zag, zig'
	Maths	Number 10	Practise counting forwards and backwards to 10 using your fingers. Play 'Saucer Sorter' on ictgames (https://www.ictgames.com/mobilePage/saucerSorter/) Set the start number at 1. Take it in turns to close your eyes while the other person hides a number using the 'Star Bar'. Can you say which number is missing? Can you talk about how you know? For example, "I know it is number 6 because 6 is one more than 5."
	Understanding the World - Science	Seasonal Changes - Winter	Some animals <i>hibernate</i> in Winter. Find out what the word 'hibernate' means. Find out about one animal that hibernates. Why does it hibernate? How long does it hibernate for? You can record what you find in any way that you like – drawing, writing, videos, etc. Listen to Miss Pigg's 'Staff story time' today which is about an animal that hibernates!

Friday	Phonics	Phase 2 Tricky Words	<p>Listen to the Phase 2 tricky word song on YouTube https://youtu.be/e2dx65u59aw</p> <p>Complete the activity on page 14 in your CGP phonics workbook.</p>
	Writing	'Spelling test'	<p>Complete a 'spelling test' with your grown up using these words: yap, yell, yet, zip, fizz, zigzag. Try to use your phonic knowledge to write them independently.</p> <p>CHALLENGE – Listen to your grown up say this sentence, 'A dog can yap.' Count how many words are in the sentence and then have a go at writing it. Remember to use your phonic knowledge to segment the sounds and don't forget finger spaces and full stops!</p>
	Maths	Writing numbers 9 and 10	<p>Practise writing the numbers that we have been focusing on this week. Use the formation rhymes on this Numberblocks video to help: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=8ii202RoEd8</p> <p>They are also listed below: 9 – 'Start with a loop then a line straight down' 10 – 'Draw a one and an oval then'</p>
	Expressive Arts and Design – Music	Singing	<p>Watch and join in with the 'Clap Your Hands – Little Green Frog' episode on the Durham Music website - https://www.durhammusic.org.uk/clap-your-hands-tiny-tunes-tuesday-for-early-years-episode-2 Join in with the singing and copy the actions. Can you change the actions? What other way might the frog move his mouth to eat a fly? Can you be the leader and sing the song to someone in your house whilst they copy you?</p> <p>Can you think of any animals that you could add to the song? E.g. "Roar, roar went the big, scary lion one day. We know lions go la, dee, da, dee, da!" You could use any toys you have at home to give you ideas for animals.</p>




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Number 9 Is It Square? Activity
