

English	<ul> <li>This week in school we will write a new adventure for Edgar. What will he get up to? Where will he go? Who will he meet? Plan you story first using a story map – you can write or draw your ideas. Remember to include conjunctions, adjectives, adverbs, exclamation marks and questions marks in your story. https://www.literacyshed.com/edgar.html</li> <li>We will also be starting our new novel this week. Before we begin to read, we are going to research the author - Dick King-Smith - and write a letter to him asking him about his life and stories. This half term we are focusing on gymnastics. This week we will practise balances:

- Rock balances: On our side, back, tummy, shoulders or bottom.
- Shell balances: On our knees or hands and feet.
- Anchor balances: On one foot.

Make some rock, anchor and shell cards showing the different balances. Ask someone at home to choose a card one at a time and then perform each balance on the card. Can you perform a different balance each time? Choose three or four cards to create a sequence of balances.

History

We are starting our new topic this week: Queens of the Castle!



We will be learning about Queen Elizabeth I and Queen Elizabeth II and comparing their lives. But before we start to learn about the queens, we must understand historical vocabulary about the topic. With an adult, please find the meanings of these words:

Castle, queen, monarch, Tudor, Windsor, Queen Elizabeth I and Queen Elizabeth II.

Then draw and colour a picture to show the meaning of each word.

Science



This week we are starting our new science topic: **plants.** Before we start the topic, we need to think about what we already know about plants. Can you name some plants? Do you know names of the parts of plants? Where do they grow? What do they need to grow? How do they get the food and water they need? Create a spider diagram about what you already know about plants. Write or draw your ideas.

Your next job is to think about what you what to learn about plants. What do you want to discover about plants? Do you want to find the largest plant in the world? What about the smallest? Can plants grow in volcanoes? What about in Antarctica? Why are plants green? Write a list of all of your questions about plants.
