
	Subject	Focus	Activity

	Science	How can we care for plants?	<b>Jack has written us a letter:</b> <i>Dear Year 2,</i> <i>I have a problem – my beanstalk is not growing! It is a yellow colour and the leaves are droopy. The big bit in the middle (I don't know what it is called) is wibbly wobbly too! Can you help me please? I want to get the gold from the giant.</i> <b>From Jack</b> Let's help him! Write down everything you know about plants as a spider diagram. (Watching the videos may help you. <a href="https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zpxnyrd">https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zpxnyrd</a> .) Then write a leaflet explaining how to care for a plant so it will grow. Remember to name the parts of the plant and to explain what the plant needs to grow and why. Are plants living things? Do they grow in different habitats? Include as much scientific vocabulary as you can. Please find a leaflet template on Tapestry.

	English	Description	<p>Today's task is to describe Farmer Hogget. We are going to include adjectives, nouns phrases, similes and alliteration. We are even going to start writing in paragraphs too!</p> <p><b>Please find a recorded PowerPoint on Tapestry.</b></p>
	Spelling	Year 2 Common Exception Words	<p>Practise these Year 2 common exception words (CEW). Focus on the words: <b>should, steak, sugar, sure, told, water, whole, who, wild</b> and <b>would</b>. Then put these words into sentences either written or verbally. Remember to practise, practise, practise!</p>
	History/PSHE	Was life the same then and now?	<p>This lesson is a joint history and PSHE lesson as it focuses on our work on RIGHTS, as we are a Rights Respecting School. Wednesday	English	Collecting Evidence	<p>Please listen to Chapter 7. (Please watch from 11.55.)  <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=d1oFleqikRs">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=d1oFleqikRs</a></p> <p>We know that Babe really wants to be a sheep-pig. Now we have to persuade Farmer Hogget to let him try. Write or draw all of the reasons why Babe should be a sheep-pig. Think about how polite he is, how the sheep like him, the sheep think Fly is a "wolf" etc... You must use evidence from the text.</p>
	Reading	Comprehension	<p>Complete "Flat Stanley" in your comprehension workbook (please see information below). Discuss the title, what type of text it is and what it is about. All of the answers are in the text – it is your job to find them. Remember to discuss the meaning of any unfamiliar words or underline important pieces of text.</p>
	RE	So, what does it mean to belong to Christianity?	<p>This is the last lesson of this unit. So, we need to show everything that we have learnt during this topic. We have learnt what baptism is, and that it is about belonging. We also researched the different objects and symbols used during a baptism. Then we discussed the issues of feeling sorry, showing care and important values to Christians. Complete a leaflet all about the topic answering the key question: <b>What does it mean to belong to Christianity?</b> Remember to include key vocabulary: <b>church, belonging, family, charity, sorry and caring</b> and pictures. You must include as much detail as possible to show me that you have answered and understand the question. Please find a leaflet template on Tapestry.</p>



What shapes can you see? Do they have windows?</i> Cut the pictures out and write your thoughts and opinions next to them. You might like to label the parts of the castle too.
