

	Subject	Focus	Activity
Monday	Handwriting	Joining	Last term we practised forming cursive letters. Now it is time to practise joining letters so we can write words. Please complete worksheets for letter "i". You can find this on Tapestry.
	Maths	Working with parts and whole activity	Watch the White Rose home learning video and pause to complete any tasks. https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-2/ Complete Fractions activities on Mathletics including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Halve it! • Making Equal Groups • Are you ready? • Shade Fractions • Divide into Equal Groups
	English	Book Review	Complete a book review about The Sheep-Pig. This is about your opinions. What happened in the story? Who is the author? Did you like the story? What was your favourite part? Who was your favourite character? Would you recommend it? Why? How many stars would you give it?
	Reading	Comprehension and word reading	Please read for twenty minutes. Think carefully before you choose your book. This can be fiction or non-fiction. Why did you choose this text? Would you recommend it? Why?
	Science	What is the best material for Goldilocks' Spoon?	**Investigation to be completed with adult supervision** Goldilocks has a problem. She needs to make a spoon to eat her delicious porridge but doesn't know what material to use! Can you help her? Plan an investigation about this. Think about what equipment you will need and what your method will be. What do you predict will happen?
Tuesday	Times Tables	x2, x3, x5 and x10 tables and division facts	Please log-on on to Times Table Rock Stars (the details are in your homework books), and complete 10 minutes of practice in the "Jamming" section. You may want to go to the "Rock Slam" section and try Mrs Kershaw's challenge!
	Maths	Make equal parts	Watch the White Rose home learning video and pause to complete any tasks. https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-2/ Collect a variety of objects that you have around the house. Then put these into equal groups. Then draw pictures of different shapes and colour these so they have equal parts. Remember that equal means the same.
	English	Plan	This week we will begin a re-telling of The Sheep-Pig. First we need to plan. Break the story into five sections: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Babe and Farmer Hogget at the fair. • Babe meeting Fly and wanting to be a sheep-pig. • Babe saving the sheep from the rustlers! • Ma's tragedy.

			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Babe winning the competition. <p>Using boxes, plan what information you will put into each section. Each one of these will become a paragraph.</p>
	Spelling	Silent letters	This week we will learn the spelling rule of words with “gn” but saying “n”. The “g” is silent. Please practise spelling the words: gnome, sign, gnaw, gnat, design, gnash and learn the spelling rule. Can you find any more words?
	Geography	What is a compass?	<i>What is a compass? What is it for? When is it used? What do the letters mean?</i> With an adult, research what a compass is used for. If you have a compass available, please travel in different directions or make a map where a character can travel north, south, east or west.
Wednesday	Maths	Revision	Please complete “Autumn Term: Workout 7” in your KS1 Maths workbook. You have ten minutes! How many questions can you complete? The answers are in the back, please mark this and record your score on page 74. I bet your scores are improving?
	Maths	Recognise a half	Watch the White Rose home learning video and pause to complete any tasks. https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-2/ Complete the worksheet on Tapestry.
	English	Re-tell: Paragraph One	It is time to write the first paragraph of the story. Include as much detail as you can. Try to include adjectives, noun phrases, similes, commas and exclamation marks. Remember to proof read and correct as you go.
	Reading	Comprehension	Complete “On the Farm” in your comprehension workbook (please see information below). Discuss the title, what type of text it is and what it is about. All of the answers are in the text – it is your job to find them. Remember to discuss the meaning of any unfamiliar words or underline important pieces of text.
	RE	How do Christians use objects to celebrate Easter?	There are different symbols used during Easter celebrations such as eggs, chicks, Easter gardens etc... How do each of these pictures connect to the Easter story? What do they symbolise? Cut out the picture. Write what it symbolises next to it. Please find a worksheet on Tapestry.
Thursday	Spelling	Number words	Please practise spelling the words for numbers eleven to twenty. You may want to try via the Spelling Frame online game: https://spellingframe.co.uk/ Select “Topic Words” and then “Maths.” Click “play” for numbers eleven to twenty and select “Segment Cards.”
	Maths	Find a half	Watch the White Rose home learning video and pause to complete any tasks. https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-2/ Calculate half of amounts by dividing by 2. Use the sharing or grouping method that was taught previously.
	English	Re-tell: Paragraph Two	It is time to write the second paragraph of the story. Re-read your work from yesterday before you begin. Include as much detail as you can. Try to include adjectives, noun phrases, similes, commas and exclamation marks. Remember to proof read and correct as you go.
	DT	Make a castle	Continue to make your castle. Remember that this must have a moving mechanism such as gate or drawbridge. This must look like a castle too – so include castle features. Please use any spare objects that you find around the house such as boxes, old cardboard etc...
